Sunday Curriculum	<p style="text-align: center;">Until February: JewQ After February: Bright Beginnings Hebrew Language Skills:</p> <p>This course begins by introducing the concepts of common Hebrew root words, prefixes and suffixes in, and then incorporates them into the texts of the Chumash. Through games and stimulated exercises, our students will learn to recognize and translate a significant portion of the text immediately, which helps remove the paralyzing “fear factor” of encountering a foreign text.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Holiday Curriculum:</p> <p>A comprehensive journey through the Jewish calendar, delving into the traditions of the various holidays and its effect on our lives</p>
